## **Homeowners Insurance Update and Resources**

The California Association of REALTORS® (C.A.R.) hosted a town hall this week with California Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara and other experts about the future of homeowners' insurance.

## **Dublin Sign Ordinance Update**

New open house sign rules may be coming to Dublin.

During their Aug.18 meeting, the Dublin City Council will consider new real estate open house regulations that could permit up to six signs to be displayed per property. Signs would be allowed on sidewalks as long as they don't impede pedestrians, block the view of traffic or restrict the sidewalk width to less than 36 inches. Signs could be displayed Saturdays, Sundays, holidays and one broker tour day per week from 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. New enforcement rules would allow city staff to issue fines and confiscate illegally-placed signs.
