It's Official - VA Buyers Can Compensate their Agent

On Tuesday, June 11, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) made it official: veterans using VA loans can compensate their agent.

According to the National Association of REALTORS®, until this policy change, veterans could not pay the buyer-broker fees when using a VA loan. NAR says the new policy on agent fees help keep veterans competitive when buying a home.
