Union City Business License Changes on November Ballot

Union City wants to change its business license policy. Measure QQ, which will be on the November ballot will ask Union City residents if they want to simplify the business license categories and make the amount charged for a business license include a percentage of gross receipts.

According to Union City staff, if Measure QQ passes, real estate brokers would pay a \$264 minimum business license tax plus 0.0025% of their gross receipts. For brokers, gross receipts includes commission or other income earned from business conducted in Union City. The first \$25,000 of gross receipts would not be subject to the tax.
