## **New state law makes Buyer-Broker Agreements mandatory**

Effective January 1, all buyers in California must sign an agreement with a real estate agent.

Governor Newsom has signed AB2992 (Nguyen) which mandates buyer-broker agency agreements, lasting no longer than three months, in all residential real estate transactions.

According to the California Association of REALTORS® (C.A.R.), these agreements would need to be signed as soon as practicable, but no later than the submittal of an offer to purchase property.

## **Learn how City Hall works**

C.A.R. is teaming up with Pepperdine University to educate REALTORS® about how local government works and how to get involved.

The weekly sessions will explore local government funding, operations, how policy decisions are made, and how you can play a role.

The six-week program is Mondays from 2 to 4:30pm from Oct 7 to Nov 11.

Proposition 33, which will be on the Nov. 5 ballot, will repeal the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act, and allow cities and counties to expand rent control.
