## **Bad Bills Brewing in Sacramento**

The California Legislature is considering more statewide rental housing rules.

According to the California Association of REALTORS® (C.A.R.), AB 1157 (Kalra), would eliminate the exemption single-family homes which are used as rental properties have from statewide rent rules.

The Tenant Protection Act of 2019 - otherwise known as AB 1482 - limits rent increases to five percent plus inflation, or up to 10 percent, whichever is lower. It also only allows housing providers to evict tenants for specific "just cause" reasons. It will sunset in 2030. Currently, most single-family homes and condominiums are exempt from those rules.

C.A.R. says AB 1157 would remove the single-family home and condominium exemption and could lower the maximum rent increase to two percent plus the percentage change in the cost of living.

C.A.R. is <u>actively opposing</u> AB 1157 and other legislation that would harm homeowners, buyers, sellers and housing providers.
