## **San Leandro Moves Closer to Rent Control**

The City of San Leandro wants more housing opportunities, safer streets and, some form of rent control - even if its not possible to have all three. The San Leandro City Council Rules Committee met May 28 to discuss options for a rent stabilization (also known as "rent control") ordinance. More than 20 members of the public testified during the meeting including tenant advocates and local rental housing providers.

There was some discussion between the Committee and City staff about why San Leandro lags in building more housing, the impact of restrictive rental housing policies on housing production and questions about allocating limited City financial and staff resources to implement rental housing policies versus investing in street repair and maintenance.

Ultimately, the Committee directed City staff to draft an ordinance that will cap rent increases at 5% annually and limit the amount of capital improvement costs that may be passed through to tenants. City staff indicated they will seek input from stakeholders while drafting the ordinance.
