NAR Advocacy Helps Veteran Homebuyers

Military veterans shopping for a home have a better chance at success thanks to NAR efforts on Capitol Hill.

On Thursday, July 31, the President signed H.R. 1815, the <u>VA Home Loan Reform</u> <u>Act</u>, which will allows veterans to compensate their real estate agents.

According to NAR, the bill overturns a VA policy implemented during 2024 that banned VA borrowers from paying real estate agents.

Earlier this year, NAR leadership urged both the House and Senate to approve H.R. 1815. NAR said that during 2023, VA loans made homeownership possible for approximately 400,000 buyers.
