Alameda County Supervisor Districts Updated

On Dec. 14, the Alameda County Board of Supervisors approved new supervisorial district boundaries.

The [district boundaries](#) are updated every ten years to ensure each County Supervisor represents an equal number of constituents. The new boundaries resulted in districts with between 330,000 to 340,00 constituents.

One of the changes is that a portion of the City of Pleasanton is now part of District 1 and will be represented by Supervisor David Haubert. The balance of Pleasanton will continue to be in District 3 and represented by Supervisor Nate Miley. The City of Fremont will continue to be split between District 1 and District 2, which is represented by Supervisor Richard Valle.
